





#### **Saint Memorials This Week**

(Adapted from My Catholic Life!)

**Memorial of the Guardian Angels** (10/2) - According to both Scripture and Tradition, God assigns guardian angels to individuals, communities, countries, groups, and even planets! Your guardian angel presents personal prayers to God. Angels guide us on our way and protect us from troubles. Angels are spirits, bodiless, pure intellect. We do not walk alone in our lives. God is with each of us and, in his goodness and out of his love for us, has given us guardian angels to watch over us. Recall the angel God sent the Israelites during their exodus in today's readings. Today is also International Day of Non-Violence established by the UN in 2007.

**Memorial of Saint Francis of Assisi** (10/4) - Todays Saint was born in the 12th century, lived in Italy, and founded the men's Order of Friars Minor, the women's Order of St. Clare, and the Third Order of Saint Francis for men and women not able to live the lives of itinerant preachers. Francis is one of the most venerated religious figures in history. He is remembered for his generosity to the poor, his willingness to minister to the lepers, and for his love for animals and nature. He is the Catholic Church's patron saint of animals and the environment. He, like St. Paul, received the stigmata, the wounds of Christ.


**Saint Faustina Kowalska, Virgin** (10/5 - Patron Saint of The Divine Mercy devotion. She was canonized by Pope John Paul II on 4/30/20) - As a sister of the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy she received visions of the suffering Jesus and detailed these encounters in her diary which led to the Divine Mercy devotion. Pope Francis added her to the Roman Calendar in 2020.

**Saint Francis Xavier Seelos** (10/5 - Invoked against cancer. Beatified by Pope John Paul II on 4/9/20.) - He was a Redemptorist priest. The Redemptorists were founded in 1732 by Saint Alphonsus Liguori for the purpose of evangelization and pastoral care. Their ministry was especially devoted to the poor and abandoned, and all who were materially or spiritually marginalized. He carried out missionary work in the United States for 23 years. He was assigned to be the priest for Saint Mary of the Assumption Church in New Orleans and while tending to the ill during a yellow-fever epidemic, he contracted the disease and died on 10/4/1867, at the age of 48.

**Saint Bruno, Priest** (10/6 - Lived from 1030–1101, known as the Patron Saint of possessed people.) He and 6 others founded the Carthusians, a strict order dedicated to prayer and work in hermitical seclusion. His locations were always austere and geographically remote to nourish internal stillness and deeper communication with God. In 1514, during a general chapter of the order, a request was made to Pope Leo X to confirm Bruno's merits and authorize a liturgical feast for the order. The pope approved and granted an equipollent (equivalent) canonization, which required no lengthy process, but was done solely on the pope's authority. In 1623, that Carthusian feast was extended to the entire Church and placed on the Roman Calendar.

Blessed Marie-Rose Durocher, Virgin (10/6 - Patron Saint of sick people and those who have lost a parent. Beatified by Pope John Paul II on 5/23/1982. She formed the Congregation of the Sisters of the Most Holy Names of Jesus & Mary. She noticed there was a shortage of schools for rural children while working as a housekeeper for her priest brother, Father Théophile, the pastor of Saint-Mathieu parish in Belœil. As a result, she dedicated herself to bringing education to children through the teaching order she founded. Blessed Marie-Rose Durocher saw a need within her local community, sensed God calling her to address it, and acted upon His will once the time was right.

### A MESSAGE FROM BISHOP LOUIS TYLKA

Growing Disciples is a multiyear pastoral planning process for the Catholic Diocese of Peoria to renew discipleship and enhance relationships with Jesus Christ in every corner of our region. The Bishop will be examining the current structure of parishes in the diocese to evaluate how they can best meet the needs of the faithful and address challenges facing the Church today.

Why are we doing this as a Diocese? We are Growing Disciples. Bishop Tylka chose that title intentionally. The world is different and we have to find new ways of doing things. We have fewer priests. Fewer Catholics. Fewer children. People are moving. We have to reimagine the way we reach people with the Good News.

The Growing Disciples process is designed to provoke conversation, to gather data and receive feedback. Based on the feedback from recent priest meetings, the Diocese is changing the way they release the second draft models. You will be able to see your parish's second draft model with appropriate context and information, online by October 1 at *cdop.org*. That way, all parishioners have access to all the information at the same time, and can come prepared to their parish meeting. Your input is needed and valued as Bishop Tylka discerns the future footprint of the Diocese of Peoria.

#### Saint Memorials This Week continued:

**Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary** (10/7) - Legend has it that at some point, frustrated with the difficulties St. Dominic encountered while trying to defeat the Albigensian heresy he was facing, he spent a few days of prayer and fasting to beseech Our Lady for guidance. Our Lady appeared to him, giving him the Rosary, revealing the mysteries to be meditated upon during the fifteen decades, and urging him to preach the mysteries and to pray the decades as a spiritual weapon.

The word "Rosary" comes from the Latin *rosarium*, which means "rose garden." Each Hail Mary is a spiritual rose; together, they make up the garden of roses. Saint Dominic did as Our Lady instructed him and became quite successful in converting the heretics. Although legend, the Dominicans are credited with development of the traditional prayer. Today's feast of Our Lady of the Rosary has its roots in a feast named Our Lady of Victory. In the late sixteenth century, the Muslims of the Ottoman Empire were expanding into southeastern Europe and the Mediterranean region.

In 1571, Pope Pius V, who was a Dominican, formed an alliance between the Papal States, Spain, Venice, and several other smaller Christian states, called the Holy League, in order to stop Ottoman aggression. On October 7 of that year, the Holy League confronted the Ottoman navy in the Mediterranean, and the pope called upon all of Europe to pray the Rosary for victory. Victory was achieved.

In gratitude, Pope Pius V instituted the Feast of Our Lady of Victory to be celebrated on the first Sunday of October every year. Two years later, Pope Gregory XIII changed the name to the Feast of the Holy Rosary. In 1671, the feast was extended to all of Spain, and in 1716, after another important victory against the Muslims, the feast was extended to the entire Church. In 1913, Pius X changed the date from the first Sunday in October to October 7. Today, this feast is celebrated under the title of Our Lady of the Rosary as a mandatory memorial on the Roman Calendar. Pope St. John Paul II added the Luminous Mysteries in 2022.


