Saint Memorials This Week (Adapted from My Catholic Life!)

Memorial of St. Hedwig, Religious (10/16) - Patron Saint of brides, widows, duchesses, those whose children have died, and difficult marriages. Invoked against jealousy. Canonized by Pope Clement IV on March 26, 1267. She was a Bavarian noble who, with her husband, Henry of Silesia, dedicated her wealth and energy to charitable works and funded religious communities. Although she was married at a very young age, she had a strong personality as she shaped her marriage and her husband's governance until he passed. She spent the rest of her life in the convent she endowed in Treibuiz.

Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, Virgin (10/16) -Patron Saint of devotees of the Sacred Heart and those who have lost a parent while young. Invoked against polio and rheumatic fever. Canonized by Pope Benedict XV on May 13, 1920 She received visions of Christ that led her to promote devotion to the Scared Heart. Although she was met with initial skepticism, within her community, she persisted in sharing her visions until her confessor, St. Claude de Columbiere. When he declared them to be genuine, he also helped her spread the message of union with Christ through devotion to his Sacred Heart.

Memorial of Saint Saint Ignatius of Antioch, Bishop and Martyr (10/17) - Early- to Mid-First Century–c. 107. Patron Saint of the Church in Northern Africa and the Eastern Mediterranean. Invoked against throat diseases. Pre-Congregation canonization. Saint John the Apostle is said to have preached in Jerusalem and then in Asia Minor. Two of his early disciples were Saint Polycarp, whom Saint John appointed Bishop of Smyrna, and Polycarp's dear friend, Saint Ignatius, Bishop of Antioch, whom we honor today. St. Ignatius, Bishop of Antioch, was among those martyred during the Roman persecutions of the second century. On that long journey to Rome, he wrote several letters of instruction and encouragement to the Christians in Asia Minor.

Feast of Saint Luke, Evangelist (10/18) - First Century, died c. age 84. Patron Saint of artists, bachelors, bookbinders, brewers, butchers, glassworkers, goldworkers, lace workers, notaries, physicians, and surgeons. Pre-Congregation canonization. He is known as the author of the Gospel that bears his name and the Acts of the Apostles. He is also identified as the "beloved physician" referred to by St. Paul. Luke was a Gentile from Antioch in Syria. He accompanied St. Paul on some of his evangelizing journeys, and he stayed with Paul when he was imprisoned in Rome.

Memorial of Saints John de Brébeuf & Isaac Jogues, Priests, and Companions, Martyrs (10/19) - They were Jesuit missionaries martyred in North America with their fellow missionaries. For the love of Christ, both returned to Huron missions voluntarily knowing the hardship and likely martyrdom that awaited them.

Memorial of St. Paul of the Cross, Priest (10/20) -He founded the Passionists to spread devotion to the passion and cross of Jesus. He found the topic of the passion to be an inexhaustible source of meditations and preaching.
