

# Saint Memorials This Week (Adapted from My Catholic Life!)

**Memorial of Saint John of Capistrano, Priest** (10/23) - Lived from 1386–1456, Patron Saint of military chaplains, judges, jurists, and lawyers. He was canonized by Pope Alexander VIII on October 16, 1690. He came from a wealthy and prominent family in Capistrano, Italy. He studied civil and canon law under a distinguished legal scholar in Perugia and excelled in his studies. In 1412, when John was about twenty-six, King Ladislaus of Naples appointed John as the Governor of Perugia. A wealthy nobleman also gave him his daughter in marriage, as well as a large dowry, making John quite wealthy. As governor, John attempted to root out corruption but was met with strong opposition. Around 1416, the powerful Malatesta family, with the support of others in Perugia, rejected King Ladislaus' authority over Perugia. When John tried to broker peace, the Malatesta family imprisoned him. This suffering led him to think more seriously about his own soul and future, coming to realize that the material things of this world and fleeting temporal power could not compare with the spiritual riches we are called to attain. Tradition holds that, while in prison, John had a dream or a vision of Saint Francis of Assisi, who instructed him to enter the Franciscan order. John decided to sell all of his property to pay the ransom for his release and enter the Franciscans, which he did on October 4, 1416, the feast of Saint Francis. He was a reformer. His preaching called both laity and clergy to a renewed life of virtue through Christ.

**Memorial of Saint Anthony Mary Claret, Bishop** (10/24) - Lived 1807–1870. Patron Saint of the Catholic press, textile merchants, and weavers. Canonized by Pope Pius XII on May 7, 1950. He founded a religious order and a press to distribute catechetical works. A man of irrepressible energy, he used his organizational gifts to create structures that could reach more people and improve more lives than he could have done on his own.

Feast of Saints Simon and Jude, Apostles (10/28) - Lived during the first Century. Simon is the Patron Saint of curriers, woodcutters, and tanners. Jude is the Patron Saint of hopeless causes and hospital workers. Two of the Twelve Apostles chosen by our Lord, they were the first two bishops through whom our Lord established His Church. Every bishop, priest, and deacon is a spiritual descendant. St. Simon the Zealot and St. Jude Thaddeus were mentioned in the New Testament and after the resurrection, are believed to have evangelized and been martyred together in Persia. Today's Simon is not Simon Peter, the Prince of the Apostles, but is referred to as "Simon the Cananean" (Matthew and Mark) and "Simon the Zealot" (Luke and Acts); both names mean "zealot." Jude is referred to as "Judas son of James" (Luke and Acts) and "Thaddeus" (Matthew and Mark).




### **RCIA: Evangelization, the First Stage of the Process**

We are currently in the evangelization stage of the RCIA process. Evangelization is defined as a proclamation of the Gospel and an invitation to follow Christ. Evangelization is the ongoing effort of all the baptized to proclaim the Gospel in word and in deeds.

After Vatican II, Pope Paul the VI wrote an apostolic letter on Evangelization (1965) that begins, "Proclaim the Gospel to the people of today." For decades the Church understood evangelization of people as something done in missionary countries. The most surprising part of the apostolic letter was that the church is not only an evangelizer, according to Pope Paul VI, "she begins [to evangelize] by being evangelized herself . . . she has a constant need of being evangelized, if she wishes to retain freshness, vigor and strength in order to proclaim the Gospel" (15).

Participants (team and seekers of faith) in the RCIA process understand that as evangelizers we need to strive to proclaim the gospel and invite one another into ongoing conversion to God. Please continue to pray for those asking for Baptism and full communion in the Catholic Church and those of our parish who are accompanying them.
