

WHAT IS THE PROCESS FOR THE HOLY FATHER'S MONTHLY GLOBAL PRAYER INTENTIONS

The Holy Father's monthly prayer intentions are entrusted to the Worldwide Prayer Network and serve as a global call to transform prayers into concrete actions. Established in 1844 as the Apostleship of Prayer, the network, initiated by the Jesuits, was modified under Pope Francis. In 2016, he renamed it The Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network, elevating it to pontifical work status in 2018. Latér, in 2020, the network attained the status of a Vatican Foundation gaining both canonical and juridical recognition. Each month, Pope Francis, through his Worldwide Prayer Network, shares prayer intentions that express his profound concerns for humanity and the mission of the Church. These monthly intentions are meant to act as a compass for a mission of compassion for the world, encouraging the faithful to combine prayer and action in building a more humane and caring world. These prayer intentions result from an extensive discernment process within the Church, incorporating proposals from various official congregations of the Holy See, and services of the Holy See across different countries. After several months of discernment, the Pope, having received the proposals, takes dedicated time to pray and discern the challenges facing humanity and the mission of the Church. Afterwards, he entrusts these twelve prayer intentions to all the faithful, providing them with guidelines for life and mission.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK (Adapted from My Catholic Life!)

Memorial of Saint Thomas Aquinas, Priest & Doctor of the church (2/)1225–1274. Patron Saint of students, Catholic schools, apologists, booksellers, chastity, philosophers, publishers, scholars, theologians. Invoked against storms. He was canonized by Pope John XXII on 7/18/1323 and proclaimed Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius V in 1567. Among the greatest intellectuals in the history of the Church, St. Thomas rises far above the rest. He is not only a Doctor of the Church but is given the titles Angelic Doctor, Common Doctor, and Universal Doctor. His impact on the Church's doctrine and intellectual understanding of the faith has been phenomenal. At 5, he began studies with the Benedictines. At 14, due to wars, he moved to the University of Naples and trained with Dominicans. They would greatly influence him, though his family tried to force him to join the Benedictines. In 1252, at the age of twenty-six, Brother Thomas was given the title "Master in Theology" by the pope. For the next twenty-two years, Thomas wrote numerous books, sermons, and commentaries on Scripture. He also composed some of our Church's most beautiful hymns, including Pange Lingua which is a Medieval Latin hymn for the Feast of Corpus Christi. It is also sung on Maundy Thursday during the procession from the church to the place where the Blessed Sacrament is kept until Good Friday.

Memorial of Saint John Bosco, Priest (1/31) - 1815–1888, Patron Saint of apprentices, boys, editors, laborers, magicians, students. Canonized by Pope Pius XI on April 1, 1934. At the age of nine, John had the first of many dreams that would influence him. The Blessed Mother appeared in the dream and began to teach John about his future mission of caring for boys with kindness. At twenty-six, John was ordained a priest and joined his mentor, Father Cafasso, in Turin. The two ministered to the poor and imprisoned, cared for girls at a boarding school, and assisted in country parishes. In 1861, some of the boys St. Bosco mentored in prison wanted to follow in his footsteps and assist other boys. St. Bosco founded the Society of St. Francis de Sales and The Salesian Order was formally approved by the Vatican in 1869. In 1871, he founded a Salesian religious order of women, the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians, to care for girls. Finally, in 1874, the Salesian Cooperators, a lay organization that worked with the male and female Salesian Orders was created.

Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (2/2) - Today's feast is celebrated in our Church forty days after Christmas, marking the day that Mary and Joseph would have taken Jesus into the Temple. Though the Son of God did not need to be redeemed, Mary and Joseph fulfilled these ritual obligations. At the heart of this celebration is the encounter of Simeon and Anna with the Christ Child in the Temple. It is in that holy encounter that Jesus' divinity is manifested by a human prophet for the first time. At His birth, the angels proclaimed His divinity to the shepherds, but in the Temple, Simeon was the first to understand and proclaim Jesus as the Savior of the World. He also prophesied that this salvation would be accomplished by a sword of sorrow that would pierce the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Anna, a prophetess, also came forward. She gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who heard her. (Luke 2:38) Thus, these ritual acts were also a moment in which Jesus' divine mission was made manifest to the world.

Memorial of Saint Blaise, Bishop and Martyr (2/3) - Died c. 316, Patron Saint of illnesses of the throat and other illnesses, wool workers, animals, bricklayers, bakers, farm workers. Pre-Congregation canonization enjoyed widespread veneration in the Eastern and Western Churches due to many cures attributed to him. According to tradition, he was Bishop of Sebaste in Armenia and was martyred under Licinius. On this day the Church gives a "Blessing of the Throats" in honor of St. Blaise. From the eighth century he has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat.

Memorial of Saint Ansgar, Bishop (2/3) - 801–865, Patron Saint of Scandinavia, Denmark, Sweden, and various locations in Germany. He was declared a saint by Pope Nicolas I c. 865. He became known as the "Apostle of the North" for his great evangelical work in Denmark and Sweden. He was Bishop of Hamburg and then of Bremen. Gregory IV appointed him as his delegate to Denmark and Sweden. Bishop Ansgar worked tirelessly to stabilize his own diocese and to evangelize the pagans in the north. He built churches, hospitals, schools, and monasteries and endured wars, invasions, and the confiscation and destruction of his churches and devoted himself to the poor.



An update about our Growing Disciples initiative from Bishop Louis Tylka

Thank you to all our priests and Key Parish Leaders from across the Diocese of Peoria for hosting Growing Disciples parish meetings to explain the second set of draft models and how parishioners could provide feedback. Gathering information from those parish meetings is a critical element in the ability to move forward in this important pastoral planning process.

The Growing Disciples Core Team received over 2600 electronic and paper surveys. Bishop Tylka received several hundred personal letters from parishioners and community members, sharing their feelings about the process and what our possibilities could be as we look to the future. The feedback has come from all over the diocese and all parishes. Not everyone in every parish, or even every family, agreed on the steps we should take moving forward.

What is clear is that this process is awakening within all of us that desire for us to continue to be the Church and to grow the Church. We are passionate about our faith. We are passionate about our parishes. We are passionate about our mission that Jesus has given to us to share the Good News.

We also know we are living in very different times. The generations that preceded us had their own challenges and opportunities to live out our faith. Ours is a very different time and we must discern a way forward to build a more sustainable, mission driven, vibrant church for tomorrow.

In the coming months, our Growing Disciples Core Team, our Diocesan Commission and ultimately the Presbyteral Council will be discerning recommendations, based on the feedback, to be given to the Bishop, who will make the final decision.

Let us remain a people of prayer: praying for each other and supporting one another as we go through this process.

HOW EARLY MAY A SATURDAY VIGIL MASS BE SET?

The *Code of Canon Law* (can. 1248) permits Catholics to fulfill their Sunday and other Mass obligations by participating in Mass "in the evening of the preceding day." Pope Pius XII, in the apostolic constitution *Christus Dominus*, set the earliest hour for such a Mass at 4 pm:

Rule VI. If the circumstance calls for it as necessary, We grant to the local Ordinaries the right to permit the celebration of Mass in the evening, as we said, but in such wise that the Mass shall not begin before four o'clock in the afternoon, on holy days of obligation still observed. . . .

WHY IS THE COLOR GREEN USED FOR ORINARY TIME?

Green is used as a liturgical color during the weeks known as *Ordinary Time*. Generally, this period occurs from the end of the Christmas season until the beginning of Lent, and from the end of the Easter season until the beginning of Advent. Not just a filler between other liturgical seasons, *Ordinary Time* has its own meaning, signified by its own color. The root of the word "ordinary" has a rich history, far beyond the humdrum, commonplace, or everyday. The word has its source in a Sanskrit or Indo-European word that entered Latin as the verb "*orior*" - meaning to rise up, to be stirred up and to grow. The word for "east" in Latin, *oriens*, conveys the same rich meaning: It indicates the rising of the sun. Hence, *Ordinary Time* for Catholics is the opportunity to allow the Lord to stir up our faith, to allow our spirits to rise, and to grow in our spiritual life. The color green is a color that evokes life and growth.
