

SAINTS OF THE WEEK (Adapted from My Catholic Life!)

Feast of the Chair of Saint Peter, Apostle (2/22)

There is a physical object known as "the Chair of St. Peter." It is housed at the Vatican, at the back of St. Peter's basilica (the apse). It is also a symbol of spiritual authority to unite the Church. In order to preserve for posterity this precious relic, Alexander VII (1655-67) enclosed the *Cathedra Petri* above the apsidal altar of St. Peter's in a gigantic casing of bronze, supported by four Doctors of the Church (two from the West: St. Ambrose and St. Augustine and two from the East: St. Athanasius and St. John Chrysostom).

Pope Benedict called it is a symbol of the special mission of Peter and his Successors to tend Christ's flock, keeping it united in faith and in charity [Angelus, Feb. 19, 2012]. The first reading (1 Peter 5:1–4) for today reminds us that the leaders of God's people are spiritual shepherds carrying on Christ's church and the Psalm (Psalm 23:1-6) reinforces the shepherding theme. In the Gospel (Matthew 16:13-19), Jesus declares Peter the rock on which he will build his church. Today's feast celebrates all that this chair. that chair as a precious relic, it also celebrates all that this chair represents. This feast was formally celebrated in Rome as early as the fourth century, but honor for the supremacy of Saint Peter and his successors was celebrated from the moment Jesus entrusted Peter with his mission.

In the Gospel of Matthew 16:13–20, the exchange between Jesus and His disciples occurs which is the basis of today's feast and our belief in the unique and universal authority of Saint Peter and his successors. Jesus asked the disciples, "who do you say that I am?" Simon responded, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." With that profession of faith, Jesus changed Simon's name to Peter, saying to him, "And I tell you, you are Peter (*Petros*), and on this rock (*petra*) I will build my church." The name "Peter" in Greek is *Petros*, meaning a single movable stone. Petra, in Greek means a solid rock formation that is fixed, immovable, and enduring.

Jesus transformed Peter from a single stone into a solid, fixed, and immovable foundation of rock on which the Church would be built and endure until the end of time. Jesus told Peter that He would give him the keys to the Kingdom of Heaven and that whatever he bound and loosed on earth would be bound and loosed in Heaven. He became the first bishop of the newly evangelized city of Antioch and then chose to go to Rome, becoming the first bishop of Rome, where he would die a martyr. The death of Saint Peter was not the death of his authority and sacred mission. Saint Linus followed him as the second bishop of Rome, followed by Saint Cletus, Saint Clement, and so forth, until today.

On the pope's authority, Vatican Councils I and II affirmed that when the pope speaks *Ex Cathedra*, meaning, "From the Chair," he speaks with the authority of Saint Peter who was entrusted with full, supreme, and universal authority to teach and govern. His teaching extends to all matters of faith and morals, and his governance encompasses the entire world. (Lumen Gentium, #22).



REGULATIONS FOR LENT AND THE EASTER TRIDUUM

Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. Priests, religious and laity are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, attentiveness to prayer, and especially to works of charity and mercy.

teveryone of 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024, and all the Fridays of Lent.

teveryone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024 and Good Friday, March 29, 2024. On these two days of fast and abstinence, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is a serious matter.


