HOLY WEEK - SO MANY OPPORTUNITIES TO SPEND TIME WITH OUR LORD

The Stations of the Cross: Walk the passion of Jesus Christ with him and share in the agony and bliss that his tremendous sacrifice gave us! This Holy Week, the Stations will be said at St. Mary on Tuesday, 3/26 at 6pm, at St. Thomas on Wednesday, 3/27 at 6pm, and on Good Friday @ 12pm at Holy Family.

TRY TO ATTEND A SPECIAL SERVICE THIS WEEK:

Mass of The Lord's Supper, followed by Adoration until Midnight: If you have never had the blessing of attending this Mass, come and join us. We celebrate our Lord's wonderful gift of himself, the Eucharist. He gave us the opportunity to receive him Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. We are joined with him when he is within us through Communion. One Priest in Florida refers to this night as the "first movement in the Paschal Celebration" of Holy Thursday, Good Friday (the second movement), and the Easter Vigil and the Easter Masses (the last or third movement), a wonderful orchestration of our faith. During this Mass (actually at every Mass), we become one of the disciples gathered around that table of celebration and sacrifice, we accept the call to share in the New Covenant in his Body and Blood. We tie ourselves to his Passion and receive his strength to move forward in this beautiful world until we are invited home to be with him.

Much like Communion, we will also be able to participate in **Adoration on Holy Thursday**. If you have never spent time in silent prayer with our Lord, Jesus Christ, tonight is a great time to try it. The Venerable Bishop Fulton Sheen noted in his autobiography, *Treasure in Clay*: "The Holy Hour is not a devotion; it is a sharing in the work of redemption. In the garden . . . Our Lord asked, 'Could you not watch one hour with me?' He asked for an hour of reparation to combat the hour of evil, an hour of victim union with the cross to overcome the anti-love of sin." (Image, 1982) In fact, V. Bishop Sheen started his daily Holy Hour devotion when he was a seminarian and continued without fail for 60 years!

The Second Movement: The Veneration of the Cross: Come to this Good Friday service. Please, please, experience the love that the cross represents and prepare yourself for his resurrection.

The Final Movement: I know many love going to Easter morning services, but you really should try an Easter Vigil Mass, at least once in your life. Sharing the light of Christ and becoming one light as a community is simply just breathtaking when we recognize his Resurrection. You also will be able to welcome new members to our Logan County Catholic Community. Easter is the gift that keeps on giving. We are so blessed to be Catholic and have this very intimate relationship with Jesus Christ.

Take advantage of new opportunities in the coming days. No matter what you do, you will be filled with his grace, his peace, and his immense love.

RCIA

This week we celebrate Passion/
Palm Sunday and begin the holiest week of the church year.
At the Mass of the Lord's Supper, on Holy Thursday, Chad
Smith, our Elect will be one of three who will process into
the church with the oils blessed (Oil of the sick and Oil of
Catechumens) and consecrated (Oil of Holy Chrism) by
Bishop Tylka earlier in the week. We use these oils in our
sacramental life. The climax of Holy Week is the Easter Vigil,
March 30 at 7:30 p.m. at Holy Family Church and will include
the Baptism, Confirmation, and reception of Holy
Communion for Chad. With the Easter sacraments, Chad
becomes our Neophyte (new born in the faith) and continues
in the RCIA process until the Feast of Pentecost.

Eucharistic Revival Prayer

Lord Jesus, you make the world radiant with the splendor of your presence. You embrace our humanity, so that we may share in your divinity. You reveal yourself to us as the Living Bread that comes down from heaven. Share your heavenly light with me, O Lord, so that I may see you in the Eucharist. Fill me with awe and wonder for the gift of your Body and Blood in Holy Communion. Through the mystery of the Eucharist unite our hearts to yours, that we may be a sign of communion for the whole world, and may live with you forever. Amen

John Lancaster Spalding Scholarship Fund Grants Now Available - Deadline is 4/26/24

Tuition assistance scholarship grants from the endowment fund established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria ROOTED IN FAITH Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding, the first Bishop of Peoria, will be available for the 2024-2025 school year for students enrolled in or intending to enroll in grades Kindergarten through 12 in any Catholic school located in the Diocese of Peoria whose families are active members of a Catholic parish in the diocese. All grants will be based on financial need objectively assessed. Information about the grants and application materials may be obtained from the Diocesan website www.cdop.org under the heading Catholic Education and then under Financial Assistance. Consult the detailed protocols and procedures and checklist for all requirements necessary to be eligible for an award. Parents must apply at: https:// online.factsmgt.com/aid. Families of students currently receiving grants are reminded that all grants are for one year only, and anyone seeking to renew a grant for the 2024-2025 school year must reapply.

Deadline date for the completed application is April 26, 2024. Notification of grant awards will be made in June of 2024.



REGULATIONS FOR THE EASTER TRIDUUM

Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. Priests, religious and laity are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, attentiveness to prayer, and especially to works of charity and mercy.

- through Good Friday, March 29, 2024 (all the Fridays of Lent).
- † Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Good Friday, March 29, 2024. On **Good Friday**, a required day of fast and abstinence, **only one <u>full</u> meatless meal is allowed**. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- † To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is a serious matter.
