RE: KITUI MISSION APPEAL ON JUNE 22/23 AND 29/ 30, 2024.

Greetings and the Peace of Christ from Christians of the Catholic Diocese of Kitui, Kenya. Thank for having Fr. Nicodemus in your parishes. He is from our diocese and his priestly education was sponsored by a family in St. Marks Catholic Church, Peoria Diocese.

Kitui is a mission diocese covering 1900 sq. miles, with 35 parishes serving 1.2 Million people. The diocese is in Arid and Semi- Arid region of the Country, where one of the greatest challenges is drought and famine. For the last five (5) years the region has not received any meaningful rainfall. Poverty level stands at 65% with malnutrition at 52%. The main source of livelihood is subsistence farming: crops and livestock, but due to recurrent drought there is frequent cycle of famine making many people rely on the Government, Non- Governmental Organizations and the Church for relief aid. The trickle down effect of this influences everything including education, since schools close due to lack of clean water and the fees for tuition are redirected to buy food since the crops fail.

Your support during this mission appeal will bring hope to many people in Kitui. The funds will be used for the following:

- 1. School Fees for our Eighty-Nine (89) Seminarians
- 2. Youth and Pontifical Missionary Childhood Formation and Evangelization
- 3. Humanitarian Support to Vulnerable Children and Families
- 4. School Fees for Needy Students in the Diocese
- 5. Support to our Water, Health and Agriculture Projects
- 6. Support to St. John Eudes Rehabilitation Centre for Street Children



FEASTS/MEMORIALS/SOLEMNITIES THIS WEEK (Adapted from My Catholic Life)

Memorial of Saint Justin, Martyr (6/1) - c. 100–c. 165 Patron Saint of philosophers, lecturers, apologists. Pre-Congregation canonization. Justin's hometown was in Samaritan territory, near Mount Gerizim, the same location where Jesus met the woman at Jacob's well and where Samaritans continue to offer sacrifice. He wrote many books and letters to Roman leaders in defense of Christianity as the true faith, the practice of worship of the true God, and the way to Heaven. This caused such a commotion that he was arrested and put on trial during Emperor Marcus Aurelius' reign. During the trial, Justin was interrogated by Rusticus, Marcus Aurelius' teacher and a fierce persecutor of Christians. After Rusticus threatened Justin and his companions with torture and death, Justin responded, "We hope to suffer torment for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ and so be saved. For this will bring us salvation and confidence as we stand before the more terrible and universal judgment-seat of our Lord and Savior." At that, Rusticus pronounced sentence on Justin and his companions, and they were beheaded.

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (6/2)

Thursday after Holy Trinity or, where this is not a holy day of obligation, on the following Sunday. In the United States, it is always transferred to the Sunday after the Most Holy Trinity. The Solemnity of Corpus Christi originated with a mystic named Saint Juliana of Lièges. She was born near Liège, Belgium around the year 1191. In 1264, Pope Urban instituted the universal Solemnity of Corpus Christi and asked the renowned theologian Father Thomas Aquinas to compose the liturgical texts for the feast. The Thursday after the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity was chosen for the annual feast in honor of the day that the Eucharist was instituted. After the death of Pope Urban IV, the Solemnity of Corpus Christi was removed from the universal calendar for about fifty-three years until Pope John XXII added it back in 1317.

Memorial of Saint Charles Lwanga and Companions, Martyrs (6/3) 1860–1886, Patron Saints of African youth, converts, and torture victims. Canonized by Pope Paul VI on October 18, 1964. Every year, millions of pilgrims from Kenya, Tanzania, Rwanda, Uganda, Nigeria, and other African nations gather at the Namugongo Martyrs' Shrine in Uganda for what has become one of the largest annual gatherings of Catholics in the world. The celebration is held at the site of the martyrdom of Saint Charles Lwanga and his twenty-one young companions on June 3 each year, the day that most of the boys were killed.

Memorial of Saint Boniface, Bishop, Martyr (6/5) - c. 675–754 Patron Saint of Great Germania. Pre-Congregation canonization. Saint Boniface is known as the "Apostle of Germany." Early in his life, he heard God calling him to be a missionary, and he generously responded. As a result, God did powerful things through him for the good of his ancestral home and beyond. His impact was so great that the seeds he planted in Germany greatly contributed to the shaping of modern-day Europe.

Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus (6/7) - On 12/27/1673, a French cloistered Visitation Nun, Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque, received the first of four visions in which Jesus revealed His Sacred Heart and His desire that a feast be instituted in its honor. These visions were directly related to the Sacred Heart. In her visions, Jesus made 12 promises to those who would honor the Sacred Heart. In 1756, seventy-five years after Margaret Mary's death, Pope Clement XIII approved devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It wasn't until 1856 that Pope Pius IX placed the Feast of the Sacred Heart on the universal Roman Calendar, to be celebrated on the Friday after Corpus Christi. The central message of the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is the infinite and compassionate love exploding from the Heart of Jesus for all mankind.

Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary (6/8) - As the Mother of God, Mary was, by nature, immaculate – free from sin. Today's feast celebrates her Immaculate Heart. Honoring Mary's Immaculate Heart leads us to ponder a heart filled with perfect love. In 1916, an angel appeared to three children at Fátima, speaking of the "infinite merits of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and of the Immaculate Heart of Mary." In 1944, Pope Pius XII instituted the universal feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary to be celebrated annually on 8/22. In 1969, Pope Paul VI moved the celebration to the Saturday after the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart.
