ST. MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL PRAYER

(Adapted from Simply Catholic)

Did you know that according to Christian tradition, St. Michael performs four offices: He fights against Satan. He rescues the souls of the faithful from the power of the

enemy, especially at the hour of death. He is the champion of God's people and the patron of the Church. And, he attends the dying and brings their souls to the judgment.

Did you know the author was Pope Leo XIII? He wrote this prayer 140 years ago on October 1, 1884. Pope Leo had just concluded saying Mass in his chapel when he was frozen as if in a trance for 10 minutes. He immediately went to his desk and wrote this prayer. It seems he heard two voices by the Tabernacle: the voice of Jesus Christ and Satan. Satan claimed he could destroy the Church in 75-100 years, given the chance. After he wrote it, he told his staff the prayer was to be said throughout the Church and was said after every Low Mass throughout the world.

Use of the prayer was discontinued in 1964 as a result of Vatican II. Pope John Paul II revived it 30 years later on April 24, 1994 in St. Peter's Square when he said "May prayer strengthen us for the spiritual battle we are told about in the Letter to the Ephesians: 'Draw strength from the Lord and from His mighty power.' (Ephesians 6:10). The Book of Revelation refers to this same battle, recalling before our eyes the image of St. Michael the Archangel (Revelation 12:7). Pope Leo XIII certainly had a very vivid recollection of this scene when, at the end of the last century, he introduced a special prayer to St. Michael throughout the Church. Although this prayer is no longer recited at the end of Mass, I ask everyone not to forget it and to recite it to obtain help in the battle against forces of darkness and against the spirit of this world."

Clearly, Pope John Paul II expected us to say it in our homes in addition to Mass. We know the short version. Remember when you read a prayer, you are having a conversation with our Lord. Make it count.

St. Michael the Archangel Protect Us and the Church.

ONE VERSION OF THE ORIGINAL PRAYER TO ST MICHAEL

O Glorious Archangel St. Michael, Prince of the heavenly host, be our defense in the terrible warfare which we carry on against principalities and powers, against the rulers of this world of darkness, and spirits of evil.

Come to the aid of man, whom God created immortal, made in His own image and likeness, and redeemed at a great price from the tyranny of the devil. Fight this day the battle of the Lord, together with the holy angels, as already thou hast fought the leader of the proud angels, Lucifer, and his apostate host, who were powerless to resist Thee, nor was there place for them any longer in heaven. That cruel, that ancient serpent, who is called the devil or Satan, who seduces the whole world, was cast into the abyss with his angels.

Behold, this primeval enemy and slayer of men has taken courage. Taking on the appearance of an angel of light, he wanders about with all the multitude of wicked spirits, invading the earth in order to blot out the name of God and of His Christ, to seize upon, slay and cast into eternal perdition souls destined for the crown of eternal glory. This wicked dragon pours out, as a most impure flood, the venom of his malice on men; his depraved mind, corrupt heart, his spirit of lying, impiety, blasphemy, his pestilential breath of impurity and of every vice and iniquity. These most crafty enemies have filled and inebriated with gall and bitterness the Church, the Spouse of the Immaculate Lamb, and have laid impious hands on her most sacred possessions. In the Holy Place itself, where has been set up the See of the most holy Peter and the Chair of Truth for the light of the world, they have raised the throne of their abominable impiety, with the iniquitous design that when the Pastor has been struck, the sheep may be scattered.

Arise then, O invincible Prince, bring help against the attacks of the lost spirits to the people of God, and give them the victory. They venerate Thee as their protector and patron; in Thee Holy Church glories as her defense against the malicious power of hell; to Thee has God entrusted the souls of men to be established in heavenly beatitude. Oh, pray to the God of peace that He may put Satan under our feet, so far conquered that he may no longer be able to hold men in captivity and harm the Church. Offer our prayers in the sight of the Most High, so that they may quickly conciliate the mercies of the Lord; and beating down the dragon, the ancient serpent who is the devil and Satan, do Thou again make him captive in the abyss, that he may no longer seduce the nations. *Amen.*

Behold the Cross of the Lord; be scattered, hostile powers. The Lion of the tribe of Judah has conquered, the root of David. Let Thy mercies be upon us, O Lord As we have hoped in Thee. O Lord, hear my prayer. And let my cry come unto Thee

FEASTS/MEMORIALS/SOLEMNITIES THIS WEEK (Adapted from My Catholic Life)

Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha (7/14) - (1656-1680) Patron Saint of Canada, Native Americans, écologists, environment, exiles, orphans, people ridiculed for their piety, and the physically impaired. Canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on 10/21/2012. Though the New York State Thruway runs close by the North American Martyrs' Shrine, traffic's roar never pierces the peace enveloping Auriesville, Ossernon to Native Americans, in the beautiful Mohawk Valley. This is where the United States' first Native American Saint was born. Kateri Tekakwitha was born barely ten years after the martyrdom of Isaac Jogues and his Jesuit and lay companions (tomahawked by Iroquois in the head and beheaded on 10/18/1646). Daughter of a Christian Algonquin mother and non-Christian Mohawk chief, Kateri's parents died in a smallpox epidemic blamed on the missionaries. Kateri was partially blinded by the smallpox scars to her face. On Easter Sunday, 1676, at the age of twenty, she was baptized and took the name Catherine, Kateri in Mohawk, after Saint Catherine of Siena. She made her First Holy Communion on Christmas Day of that same year. For the next two and a half years, Kateri embraced her faith with profound devotion. She attended Mass daily, often twice a day, and spent most of her free time in the chapel, praying on her knees. She not only prayed profoundly, she also inflicted severe penances upon herself. On 3/25/1679, with the assistance of her spiritual director, Kateri made a private vow of perpetual virginity. One year later, after her health continued to deteriorate, she died at the age of twenty-four. She had spent four years as a baptized Christian and one year as a consecrated virgin. As soon as she died, the scars on her face disappeared, and God made her face as beautiful as her soul. Word of her death spread rapidly from village to village, all across New France (Canada) and even to the Royal Court. "The saint has died!" they said. Everyone knew who the "saint" was. After her death, many miracles took place, especially for those who prayed at her tomb, including many deep conversions. St. Kateri Tekakwitha has been given the affectionate name, "Lily of the Mohawks." A lily is a symbol of purity, which Kateri manifested in her life. Lilies bloom only for a short time, just as her life was short.

Memorial of Saint Bonaventure, Bishop and Doctor of the Church (7/15) - c. 1217–1274. Invoked against intestinal problems. Canonized by Pope Sixtus IV on 4/14/1482. Proclaimed the Seraphic Doctor of the Church by Pope Sixtus V in 1588. He was born during the last decade of Francis of Assisi's life and would be closely tied to the saint and his Franciscan order throughout his own life. In fact, as a child, he received a miraculous healing from Francis of Assisi. In 1243, he joined the Franciscans and took the name Bonaventure. He began a rigorous study regimen, with a special focus on the Sacred Scriptures. In 1257, the Franciscans held a General Chapter and elected Father Bonaventure as the order's Minister General, a role he would hold for seventeen years. Popes regularly sought Father Bonaventure's counsel. In 1274, Pope Gregory X ordained him a bishop, appointed him as a cardinal, and tasked him with guiding the Second Council of Lyon, aimed at restoring the unity of the Eastern and Western Churches. Before the council concluded, Cardinal Bonaventure passed away at the age of fifty-six.

Memorial of Our Lady of Mount Carmel (7/16) - Late Twelfth–Early Thirteenth Century. Patron Saint of Bolivia and the Carmelite Order. Invoked for those in Purgatory. At the base of Mount Carmel, on the northwest coast of Israel, lies the Carmelite monastery, *Stella Maris*, Latin for "*Star of the Sea*," a chapel dedicated to Mary. The monastery is built over a cave believed to have been where the prophet Elijah, inspired by God, successfully challenged 450 prophets of Baal in a contest to the death. In an attempt to help the new order



FEASTS/MEMORIALS/SOLEMNITIES THIS WEEK continued:

(Our Lady of Carmel, continued):

gain wider acceptance within the Church, Simon Stock, the Carmelites' Superior General, and his fellow hermits sought the Blessed Virgin Mary's intercession. In 1251, she responded by appearing to Simon while holding the Christ Child in one arm and a brown scapular in the other. She said to him, "Receive, my beloved son, this habit of thy order: this shall be to thee and to all Carmelites a privilege, that whosoever dies clothed in this shall never suffer eternal fire...It shall be a sign of salvation, a protection in danger, and a pledge of peace." In the fifteenth century, the Carmelite order expanded to include women in religious service and a lay third order. In 1726, Pope Benedict XIII placed the Carmelite devotion to our Blessed Mother on the universal calendar of the Church under the title of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

Memorial of Saint Camillus de Lellis, Priest (7/18) -1550–1614. Patron Saint of the sick, hospitals, hospital workers, nurses, and nursing associations. Invoked against the vice of gambling. Canonized by Pope Benedict XIV on 6/29/1746. his mother had a dream that she would have a son who would wear a red cross on his chest and lead others with the same cross. As a teenager, Camillus joined his father on military campaigns. In Camillus' mid-twenties, he did menial work in a Franciscan friary after his military regiment was disbanded. One day, a saintly friar told him, "God is everything. The rest is nothing. One should save one's soul which does not die." Soon after, he converted and applied to be a monk there; it was rejected due to his unhealed leg wound. Camillus found work in Rome at Saint James Hospital for the Incurable. There, he received treatment while caring for the sick and dying and living a life of prayer and penance. Camillus's newfound faith and penitential life made him stand out, and he was made the hospital's director. When St. Philip Neri became Camillus' spiritual director, he encouraged Camillus to become a priest. With St. Philip's help, Camillus found a benefactor, completed his theological studies, and was ordained a priest at age 34. In addition to working at the hospital, they ministered to the homebound, the sick, and the dying. In 1586, Pope Sixtus V formally approved Camillus' new congregation later known as the Camillians. They wore black habits with a large red cross.


