### What is the Jubilee?

"Jubilee" is the name given to a particular year. This name comes from the instrument used to launch it. In this case, the instrument is the *yobel*, the ram's horn, used to proclaim the Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur). This (Jewish)

holiday occurs every year, but it takes on special significance when it marks the beginning of a Jubilee year. An early indication of it in the Bible notes a Jubilee year was to be marked every 50 years, since this would be an "extra" year - one which would happen every seven weeks of seven years (every 49 years, Leviticus 25:8-13). Even though it wasn't easy to organize, it was intended to be marked as a time to re-establish a proper relationship with God, with one another, and with all of creation. It also involved the forgiveness of debts, the return of misappropriated land, and a fallow period for the fields.

The Gospel of Luke, quoting the prophet Isaiah, describes Jesus' mission: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord" from Luke 4:18-19; cf. Isaiah 61:1-2. Jesus lived out these words in his daily life, in his encounters with others, and in his relationships, all of which bring about liberation and conversion.

In 1300, Pope Boniface VIII called the first Jubilee, also known as a "Holy Year," as it is a time when God's holiness transforms us. The frequency of Holy Years has changed over time: at first, they were celebrated every 100 years; in 1343, Pope Clement VI reduced the gap between Jubilees to every 50 years, and in 1470, Pope Paul II made it every 25 years. Extraordinary Holy Years have occurred: for example, in 1933 Pope Pius XI chose to commemorate the 1900<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Redemption, Pope John Paul II held a Jubilee Year in 2000, while in 2015 Pope Francis proclaimed the Year of Mercy as an extraordinary jubilee. The way in which Jubilee Years are marked has also changed through the centuries. Originally the Holy Year consisted of a pilgrimage to the Roman Basilicas of St. Peter and St. Paul, later other signs were added, such as the Holy Door. By participating in the Holy Year, a plenary indulgence is possible. (www.iubilaeum2025.va/en)

Each month of the year is dedicated to a specific Catholic devotion based on historical events or the liturgical calendar.

In August: The Month of the Immaculate Heart

The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The physical heart of Mary is venerated (in comparison to the adoration of the Sacred Heart of Jesus) because it is united to her person and is the seat of her love (especially for her divine Son), virtue, and inner life. Such devotion is an incentive to a similar love and virtue.

The entire month of August falls within the liturgical season of **Ordinary Time**, which is represented by the liturgical color **green**. This symbol of hope is the color of the sprouting seed and inspires in the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of heaven, especially the hope of a glorious resurrection. It is used in the offices and Masses of Ordinary Time.

## FEASTS/MEMORIALS/SOLEMNITIES THIS WEEK (Adapted from My Catholic Life)

Feast of Sts. Martha, Mary, & Lazarus (7/29) Martha -Patron Saint of cooks, butlers, dieticians, homemakers, innkeepers, maids, single laywomen, servers, and travelers; Mary - Patron Saint of spiritual studies and lectors; Lazarus Patron Saint of gravediggers. Martha, Mary, and their brother Lazarus were close friends of Jesus. He came to their home simply as a welcomed guest, rather than as one celebrating the conversion of a sinner like Zacchaeus. The sisters felt free to call on Jesus at their brother's death, even though a return to Judea at that time seemed to spell almost certain death. Martha's great glory is her simple and strong statement of faith in Jesus after her brother's death. "Jesus told her, 'I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?' She said to him, 'Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world" (John 11:25-27). Many legends exist about the life of Lazarus after the death and resurrection of Jesus. But, it is true Christ loved all three and they believed him to be their Savior. In its 2021 decree on combining veneration of Mary and Lazarus with Martha, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Sacraments said, "In the household of Bethany, the Lord Jesus experienced the family spirit and friendship of Martha, Mary and Lazarus, and for this reason the Gospel of John states that he loved them. Martha generously offered him hospitality, Mary listened attentively to his words and Lazarus promptly emerged from the tomb at the command of the one who humiliated death."

Memorial of Saint Peter Chrysologus, Bishop and **Doctor of the Church** (7/30) Peter "of the Golden Words," as he was called, became bishop of Ravenna, the capital of the empire in the West as a young man. At the time, paganism existed in his diocese, and Peter was determined to drive it out. His weapon: the short sermon, many of which have been handed down to us. They do not contain great originality of thought. They are, however, full of moral applications, sound in doctrine, and historically significant as they reveal Christian life in fifth-century Ravenna. So authentic were his sermons that 13 centuries later, he was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Benedict XIII. He wanted to teach and motivate his own flock and was recognized as a teacher of the Universal Church. In addition to his zeal for his office, Peter Chrysologus had a fierce loyalty to the Church, not only in its teaching, but in its authority. He looked upon learning not as a mere opportunity but as an obligation for all. His liturgical feast is celebrated on July 30. Next to virtue, learning, in his view, was the greatest improvement to the human mind and the support of true religion. Ignorance is not a virtue. To be fully human is to expand our knowledge, whether sacred or secular, according to our talent and opportunity.

**Memorial of Saint Ignatius of Loyola, Priest** (7/31) (b. 1491, d. 1556). Patron Saint of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), Spiritual Exercises, soldiers, and retreats. Canonized by Pope Gregory XV on March 12, 1622. In the year 1521, a cannon ball fractured the left leg of Captain Ignatius Loyola, the future founder of the Jesuits. While he was recuperating, Ignatius read about Christ and His saints and turned himself over to God. He equipped himself for Christ's service through a good classical and theological education. Ignatius spent several years studying in Spain and Paris where he met future saints Francis Xavier and Peter Faber. In 1537, Ignatius and his companions moved to Venice and were ordained priests. In 1540, the three co-founded the Society of Jesus, or Jesuits. The following year, Ignatius was elected superior, a role he would hold until his death. Over the next two decades, the Jesuits grew to 1,000 members, served in thirty-five schools they founded, and became missionaries. Over the next

century, they played a significant role in the Catholic Counter-Reformation, defending orthodoxy and the pope. Ignatius died on July 31, 1556. Pius XI, in response to the prayers of the body of bishops, declared him the heavenly patron of all *Spiritual Exercises*.

Memorial of Saint Alphonsus Liguori, Bishop and **Doctor of the Church** (8/01) Patron Saint of confessors and moral theologians. Invoked against scrupulosity, arthritis, and for final perseverance. Canonized by Pope Gregory XVI in 1839. Proclaimed a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius IX in 1871. Alphonsus Marie was born into the noble Liguori family in Marinella, the Kingdom of Naples, modern-day Italy. The eldest of seven children in a devout Catholic home. Due to poor eyesight and asthma, Alphonsus couldn't repeat his father's naval career. At sixteen, he earned his civil and Church law degree from the University of Naples. For the next eight years, Alphonsus won case after case as a lawyer in Naples. After leaving the law, he decided to serve God alone and becoming a priest in 1726 at age thirty. Father Alphonsus became a beloved confessor, treating every penitent with mercy and always offering absolution, never doubting the repentant's sincerity. From the pulpit, he preached so that even the poorest and most uneducated could understand him. He was so effective that the most serious sins all but disappeared in Naples. In 1732, 13 joined Father Alphonsus to form the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer. In 1762, Father Alphonsus was appointed Bishop of Sant'Agata dei Goti, just northeast of Naples. As his health failed, he resigned and spent his last 12 years writing and praying.

Memorial of Sts. Eusebius of Vercelli, Bishop, and **Peter Julian Eymard, Priest** (8/02) **St. Eusebius** was a Roman priest of the fourth century. He was the founder of the Canons Regular, priests living under a religious rule and dedicated to pastoral work. He was condemned by Constantius, Arian Emperor, to be starved to death in a room in his own house. He was buried in the cemetery of St. Calixtus. His cult has always enjoyed special favor in Rome and his house was transformed into a church. **St. Peter Julian Eymard's** faith journey drew him from being a priest in the Diocese of Grenoble (1834) to joining the Marists five years later in 1839. He founded the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament in 1856 whose mission was to work with children in Paris to prepare them to receive their first Communion. Additionally, they reached out to non-practicing Catholics asking them to repent and begin receiving Holy Communion again. He was beatified in 1925 and canonized in 1962 one day after Vatican II's first session ended.
