## **The Papal Bull**

We have heard the term Papal Bull in the past. It actually refers to an official document written in Latin issued by the Pope "a Papal Bull of Indictment." The name came from the stamp which was used to make it official - the lead seal from the Latin word "bulla." The seal contains the Pope's name and signature on one side and the heads of Peter and Paul on the other. It legitimizes the document and has been used since the 12th Century. It represents the Pope's exercise of his supreme power over the Church as the successor of Peter, the Vicar of Christ on Earth.

Papal Bulls have been used to establish and clarify Church doctrines. They have been used to address the heresies and challenges to theology over the ages. They also have been used to address secular items for example granting



privileges and confirming religious orders, in addition to social and ethical issues. Overall, it is a tool used to express the Church's mission "to guide, teach, and govern the faithful in their journey towards eternal life." (www.catholicshare.com)

The Papal Bull entitled "Spes Non Confundit" (Hope does not disappoint) announced the Bull of Indictment of the Ordinary Jubilee of the Year 2025 on issued on May 9, 2024. It declared the Jubilee Year will officially begin when the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica is opened on Christmas Eve of this year. Pope Francis also decreed that every cathedral worldwide should offer a Maa on 12/29/24 as the solemn opening of the Jubilee Year for their local communities. He also encouraged the organization of pilgrimages to the cathedrals for the event. The 2025 Jubilee will officially end on January 6, 2026, the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, with the closing of the Holy Door in St. Peter's Basilica. (catholicnewsagency.com)

2024 is the Year of Prayer leading to the 2025 Jubilee Holy Year of Hope: "we are called to be tangible signs of hope to our brothers and sisters who experience hardships of any kind." Pope Fransis added he hoped to open a Holy Door within a prison during the Jubilee Year "as a sign inviting prisoners to look to the future with hope and a renewed sense of confidence." Historically, these years included freeing prisoners and the forgiveness of debts as manifestations of God's mercy as demanded in the Book of Leviticus.

Each month of the year is dedicated to a specific Catholic devotion based on historical events or the liturgical calendar.

#### In August: The Month of the Immaculate Heart

The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The physical heart of Mary is venerated (in comparison to the adoration of the Sacred Heart of Jesus) because it is united to her person and is the seat of her love (especially for her divine Son), virtue, and inner life. Such devotion is an incentive to a similar love and virtue.

The entire month of August falls within the liturgical season of **Ordinary Time**, which is represented by the liturgical color **green**. This symbol of hope is the color of the sprouting seed and inspires in the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of heaven, especially the hope of a glorious resurrection. It is used in the offices and Masses of Ordinary Time.

#### FEASTS/MEMORIALS/SOLEMNITIES THIS WEEK (Adapted from My Catholic Life)

Memorial of the Dedication of the Basilica of Saint Mary Major in Rome (8/5) (Our Lady of the Snows) c. 352. In 313, Roman Emperor Constantine the Great issued the Edict of Milan, making Christianity legal and ending state-led persecutions of Christians. Over the next forty years, many people in Rome and throughout the empire converted. Legend has it that Mary, the Mother of God decided to help the Church in Rome find its way. In 352, a wealthy Roman aristocrat named John and his wife, who were childless and faithful Christians, offered their money to help expand the Church. After John prayed for direction, our Blessed Mother appeared to him in a dream on 8/4/352, informing him that she wanted a church built in Rome on Esquiline Hill. She said, even though it was summer, snow would fall on the spot the next day. When John woke up on August 5, he went to tell Pope Liberius about his dream-vision. To John's surprise, the pope had a similar dream the night before, they decided to go to Esquiline Hill. They found fresh snow in the form of a foundation for a church. The pope used the snow to outline the foundation and ordered the church to be built. John and his wife paid for the project, and the church was called Basilica Liberiana, after Pope Liberius. Today, Santa Maria Maggiore (St. Mary Major) is one of the four main basilicas in Rome. Santa Maria Maggiore contains a triumphal arch and stunning nave mosaics, which date to the fifth century. Under the main altar is the church's most sacred relic, the wood of the manger in which the baby Jesus was laid. Another important relic is the Salus Populi Romani, an icon of the Blessed Virgin Mary According to legend, this ancient icon was painted by St. Luke, the Gospel writer. For centuries, as a reminder of the miraculous summer snowfall, white rose petals have been dropped on the faithful from the dome of the Basilica every August 5th. For more than 1,600 years, almost every pope has offered Mass there, millions have prayed there, and numerous saints have made a pilgrimage to the holy church.

Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord (8/6) c. 32. All three Synoptic Gospels record the event of the Lord's Transfiguration (<u>Matthew 17:1–8</u>, <u>Mark 9:2–8</u>, <u>Luke 9:28–36</u>). Just before the Transfiguration, the three Gospels also reflect Jesus' trip with His disciples to Caesarea Philippi, about thirty miles north of the Sea of Galilee. It was a primarily pagan Greek town occupied by the Romans. The Greek god Pan was worshiped there in a cave often referred to as the gate to the netherworld due to its association with Pan. It was there that Jesus asked His disciples who they thought He was. Peter declared, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." Jesus then blessed Peter and announced His intent to build His Church upon Peter, declaring that "the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it..." (Matthew 16:16–18). After this exchange, Jesus began revealing His fate, His journey to Jerusalem to suffer and die. Jesus responded sternly to Peter's resistance, correcting his human thinking with divine wisdom (<u>Matthew 16:22–23</u>). This is the context of the Feast of the Transfiguration. First, Jesus proclaimed the triumph of His Church over evil. Second, He informed the disciples that this victory would be achieved through His own suffering and death. Understanding their struggle, Jesus took His three closest companions, Peter, James, and John, up a high mountain. There He was transfigured before them, radiating pure white light, conversing with Moses and Elijah, and was affirmed in His identity by the Father as His divine Son with whom He was well pleased. This event was likely meant to reinforce the disciples' faith after a week when they pondered Jesus' foretelling of His suffering and death, along with His insistence that they must follow Him. The Transfiguration affirmed Jesus' divinity and His relationship with Moses and Elijah. After the Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus, these three Apostles shared their experience of the Transfiguration, fortifying others in the faith. This story is

shared today to strengthen us as we bear our own crosses. The Feast of the Transfiguration is strategically placed 40 days before the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross. View the Transfiguration as a preparation for both the Cross of Christ and our participation in that triumph. According to the Gospel, we are called to take up our crosses and follow Jesus for the glory of the Father, the fulfillment of His will, and the good of the Church, which will always prevail against the gates of hell.

Memorial of Saint Dominic, Priest (8/8) 1170–1221 Patron Saint of astronomers, scientists, and those falsely accused. Canonized by Pope Gregory IX in 1234. Dominic was born to noble parents in Castile, present-day Spain. An early biographer tells that his mother, struggling to conceive, made a pilgrimage to a local monastery where St. Dominic of Silos had been abbot. At that time, she dreamt that a dog emerged from her womb and, with a torch, set the world on fire. "Dominic" is translated as 'The Lord's Dog." Today's saint came from a holy family, excelled at his studies, and was devoted to the poor. Miracles that God worked through Father Dominic resulted in conversion and new followers. In 1215, with the Bishop of Toulouse's permission, Fr. Dominic founded an order of men dedicated to evangelization. The following year, Pope Honorius III gave formal consent to the Order of Preachers, also known as the Dominicans.

Memorial of Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein), Virgin and Martyr (8/9) 1891–1942 Patron Saint of Europe. Canonized by Pope John Paul II in 1998. Although her mother was an observant Jew, Edith decided she was agnostic around the age of 14, breaking her mother's heart. In 1921, Edith visited Hedwig Conrad-Martius one of the early women pioneers in German philosophy who had recently converted to Catholicism Edith picked up the autobiography of Saint Teresa of Ávila and after reading it, is said to have said, "This is the truth!" The truths contained in St. Teresa's book changed Edith's life. She left her teaching position, learned the Catholic faith, and was baptized on 1/1/1922. In October 1933, Edith was accepted into the Discalced Carmelite Monastery of Our Lady of Peace, Lindenthal, Cologne, Germany when the Nazis began their rise. She took the religious name Sister Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, after Saint Teresa of Avila and Saint John of the Cross. In 1942, the Dutch bishops' conference issued a statement read at all Masses condemning the Nazis and their oppression of the Jews. In retaliation, the Nazis arrested all Catholic converts from Judaism, including St. Teresa Benedicta and her sister Rosa. On 8/9/1942, both were led into the gas chambers at Auschwitz where their mortal bodies perished. St. Teresa is considered a martyr because she died as a result of the moral clarity issued by the bishops against Nazi oppression and because she chose to remain faithful to her religious vocation, despite the clear risks.

**Feast of Saint Lawrence, Deacon and Martyr** (8/10) Patron Saint of book lovers, cooks, comedians, deacons, librarians, poor people, seminarians, winemakers, and Rome. Invoked against fire and lumbago (lower back pain). St. Augustine of Hippo and Pope St. Gregory the Great, provided what we know about this Saint. The Church has revered him from at least the 4th century. He is one of the few early martyrs named in Eucharistic Prayer I (the Roman Canon). Deacon Lawrence was burned on a gridiron for protecting the churches property. Tradition holds that a basilica was built over his tomb. It became one of the seven main churches in Rome, the Basilica di San Lorenzo fuori le Mura.
