

RCIA: Rite of Acceptance into the Catechumenate

Recently Chad located in Lincoln and with the inspiration of the Holy Spirit found his way to Holy Family Church and the RCIA process.

He will formally be accepted as a catechumen at the 10 a.m. Mass at Holy Family Church on December 10. Following the Mass, the Knights of Columbus Ladies Auxiliary will provide a little reception. Saint Memorials This Week

(Adapted from My Catholic Life!)

Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe (12/12) - Patroness of the Americas. Between 1428 and 1521, the Aztec Empire thrived in present-day central Mexico. Over the next ten years, Franciscan missionaries arrived on Spanish ships to serve the spiritual needs of the new settlers and to share the Gospel with the natives. Among the first converts to the Catholic faith were a peasant named Cuauhtlatoatzin and his wife, baptized around the year 1524, given the Christian names Juan Diego and María Lucía. María died around the year 1529. On 12/9/1531, Juan Diego's life was forever changed. As he passed by Tepeyac Hill, a heavenly woman appeared to him. She appeared as a mestiza woman, a mixture of Spanish and Indigenous heritage, with dark-toned skin and long black flowing hair. As soon as she appeared, she spoke to Juan in his native Nahuatl language, referring to him affectionately as 'Juanito" (My little Juan). She introduced herself as the Ever-Virgin Mary, the Mother of God. She told Juan that she wanted a church built on that very spot in her honor and instructed him to inform Bishop Zumárraga of her request. She asked Juan to climb a hill where he would find roses that were not in bloom that time of year. He did so, picked them, and returned to her. She rearranged the roses in his cloak (tilma) and told him to go to the bishop and show him the roses as proof for him, so Juan set off for the bishop's residence. Once the bishop saw, he agreed to build the chapel as requested. The tilma itself is believed to be miraculous for many reasons. The cloth on which the image is imprinted is made from cactus and normally disintegrates after about fifteen years. The tilma is now almost 500 years old and is in perfect condition. Today the Basilica in which the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe is enshrined remains one of the most sacred places of inspiration and pilgrimage in the Americas.

Memorial of Saint Lucy, Virgin and Martyr (12/13) -Patron Saint of blind people, martyrs, peasants, poor people, sick children, authors, cutlers, farmers, glassmakers, glaziers, gondoliers, laborers, lawyers, notaries, eye doctors, porters, printers, saddlers, sailors, salesmen, seamstresses, tailors, upholsterers, weavers, and writers. Invoked against dysentery, epidemics, hemorrhages, throat infections, fire, poverty, and spiritual blindness. She declared herself to Christ at a young age. There are legends about her demise, but after many efforts to try to kill her, she succumbed to death when a soldier was ordered to thrust his sword into her neck.

Memorial of Saint John of the Cross, Priest and Doctor of the Church (12/14) - Patron Saint of contemplatives, mystical theology, and Spanish poets. He was canonized by Pope Benedict XIII on 12/27/1726 and declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius XI in 1926. He is commonly referred to as the "Mystical Doctor." Juan de Yepes y Alvarez was born in Fontiveros, Ávila, Spain. His family descended from Jewish converts who settled in Fontiveros. His father, Gonzalo, was an accountant who worked for relatives who were involved in the silk trade. He was a Carmelite priest, spiritual director to St. Teresa of Avila's convent, a writer, mystic, and reformer who lived during the early years of the Counter-Reformation. His efforts at reform met with opposition, misunderstanding, and even imprisonment. Saint John of the Cross endured many trials throughout his life, but God used those trials as a foundation for the spiritual formation he would provide to the Church through his masterful mystical theology.

Gaudete Sunday - Each Third Sunday of Advent the priests wear rose-colored vestments to indicate a joyful feast day or holiday. During the season of Advent, we await the celebration of Christ's birth and His coming again at the end of time. Over four weeks, we prepare our hearts for Christmas in penitential reflection, but in the middle of the season, Gaudete Sunday calls us to rejoice in hope! Advent wreaths are shaped in a perfect circle to symbolize the eternity of God and have four candles (three are purple - penance, one pink - hope) that remind us Christ is the light of the world.
