

FEASTS/MEMORIALS/SOLEMNITIES THIS WEEK (Adapted from My Catholic Life)

Memorial of Saint Augustine Zhao Rong, Priest and Companions, Martyrs (7/9) - 1648–1930, Invoked for the people of China. Canonized by Pope John Paul II on 10/1/2000. The 120 saints we honor today spilled their blood for the faith. The first to be martyred was Father Francisco Fernández de Capillas, a Spanish Dominican priest. In 1642, Father de Capillas arrived for his final mission in mainland China. He and his companions worked hard for the next several years, winning over many converts and even establishing a lay order of Dominicans. By 1647, Father de Capillas was captured, imprisoned, and tortured. Two months later, he was sentenced to death and immediately decapitated charged with teaching false doctrine and opposing the new emperor. He died while praying the sorrowful mysteries of the rosary. 100 years later, between 1747–1748, 5 more Spanish Dominicans were martyred. In 1814, persecutions picked up again directed at native-born Chinese Christians. Among them was Father Augustine Zhao Rong, a priest of the Diocese of Chengdu, China. His name is attached to today's memorial, he was the first native-born Chinese priest and the first Chinese priest to be martyred. Arrested, he was offered the opportunity to renounce the Catholic faith but refused. After horrific tortures, St. Augustine died of his injuries in prison. Between 1814 and 1862, 26 Christians were martyred in China. In the summer of 1900, terrible persecution of foreigners and Christians occurred. The Boxer Rebellion claimed the lives of 86 martyrs, including many religious sisters, priests, catechists, and other laity. In addition to the 86 canonized martyrs, thousands of other Christians died. The final two martyrs honored today, an Italian priest and bishop, died in 1930. From the martyrdom of Father de Capillas until 1930, 119 other Catholic saints would follow in his footsteps as martyrs in China. 87 were native Chinese Christians who were lay catechists, merchants, cooks, farmers, and even a young boy. 33 were foreign missionaries from various religious orders, working to spread the Gospel at the risk of their lives.

Memorial of Saint Benedict, Abbot (7/11) - c. 480–c. 547 Patron Saint of Europe, monks and religious orders, architects, dying people, cave explorers, schoolchildren, agricultural workers, civil engineers, and coppersmiths. Invoked against erysipelas, fever, gallstones, inflammatory diseases, kidney disease, nettle rash, poison, temptations, and witchcraft. Canonized by Pope Honorius III in 1220. Declared Patron Saint of Europe by Pope Paul VI in 1964. Benedict was born northeast of Rome, a member of the nobility. At age 20, Benedict left his studies in Rome to seek a life of virtue. After living in the Church of Saint Peter in Affile, he became a hermit, spending 3 years prayerfully rooting out his sin, especially the most common temptations. Over the next two decades, he served as abbot to a group of local monks and founded 12 small monasteries around Subiaco. Numerous miracles were said to take place through his intervention, and while his radical way of living attracted followers, it angered others to the point they tried to kill him. At age 50, Benedict moved 60 miles southeast to the mountaintop of Monte Cassino. There, he destroyed a temple built to the Roman god Apollo, building two chapels in its place, and then constructed a monastery. His "Rule of Saint Benedict" guided the monks at Monte Cassino and became the rule for Western monasticism for the next 1,500 years. The "Rule" consists of seventy-three short chapters that lay out guidelines for stability, conversion of life, obedience, prayer, work, community life, hospitality, and humility. He also helped his twin sister, St. Scholastica, found a monastery for women, with his Rule guiding their daily life. The two remained close until her death when Benedict had a vision of Scholastica being taken to Heaven. He brought her body to Monte Cassino to be buried in his future grave that the two now share. After less than ten years at Monte Cassino, Benedict died, but his influence on the Church and all of Europe had just begun.

Memorial of Saint Henry (7/13) - 973–1024, Patron Saint of kings, Benedictine Oblates, handicapped people, and those rejected from religious orders. Invoked against sterility. Canonized by Pope Eugene III in 1146. In 1002, he had himself appointed King of Germany. Finally, in 1014, King Henry II was crowned Holy Roman Emperor by Pope Benedict VIII in Rome. Henry was fond of prayer, visiting churches for extended periods of time. He harbored a deep devotion to the Mother of God, regularly received the sacraments, and prayed the Divine Office. Of all the Holy Roman Emperors through the ages, only King Henry II is recognized as a saint. While many Holy Roman Emperors might have had strong faith and advanced it, St. Henry stands out. He loved God and used his power and wealth to further the Church's mission.
