RE: KITUI MISSION APPEAL ON JUNE 22/23 AND 29/ 30, 2024.

Greetings and the Peace of Christ from Christians of the Catholic Diocese of Kitui, Kenya. Thank for having Fr. Nicodemus in your parishes. He is from our diocese and his priestly education was sponsored by a family in St. Marks Catholic Church, Peoria Diocese.

Kitui is a mission diocese covering 1900 sq. miles, with 35 parishes serving 1.2 Million people. The diocese is in Arid and Semi- Arid region of the Country, where one of the greatest challenges is drought and famine. For the last five (5) years the region has not received any meaningful rainfall. Poverty level stands at 65% with malnutrition at 52%. The main source of livelihood is subsistence farming: crops and livestock, but due to recurrent drought there is frequent cycle of famine making many people rely on the Government, Non- Governmental Organizations and the Church for relief aid. The trickle down effect of this influences everything including education, since schools close due to lack of clean water and the fees for tuition are redirected to buy food since the crops fail.

Your support during this mission appeal will bring hope to many people in Kitui. The funds will be used for the following:

- 1. School Fees for our Eighty-Nine (89) Seminarians
- 2. Youth and Pontifical Missionary Childhood Formation and Evangelization
- 3. Humanitarian Support to Vulnerable Children and Families
- 4. School Fees for Needy Students in the Diocese

- 6. Support to St. John Eudes Rehabilitation Centre for Street Children



FEASTS/MEMORIALS/SOLEMNITIES THIS WEEK (Adapted from My Catholic Life)

Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary (6/8) - As the Mother of God, Mary was, by nature, immaculate – free from sin. Today's feast celebrates her Immaculate Heart. Honoring Mary's Immaculate Heart leads us to ponder a heart filled with perfect love. In 1916, an angel appeared to three children at Fátima, speaking of the "infinite merits of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and of the Immaculate Heart of Mary." In 1944, Pope Pius XII instituted the universal feast of the Immaculate Heart Of Mary to be celebrated annually on 8/22. In 1969, Pope Paul VI moved the celebration to the Saturday after the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart.

Memorial of St. Barnabas, Apostle (6/11) - Early First Century c. 61, Patron Saint of Cyprus, Antioch, Invoked against hailstorms, patron of peacekeeping missions. Pre-Congregation canonization. St. Barnabas, originally named Joseph, was born on the isle of Cyprus and was a Jew of the tribe of Levi (see <u>Acts 4:36</u>). Nothing else is known about his early life. During Jesus' public ministry, Joseph became His fervent follower and might have been one of the seventytwo disciples whom Jesus sent out on a mission (see Luke 10:1–24). After Pentecost, as the Church in Jerusalem began to grow, the Apostles changed Joseph's name to Barnabas, which means "son of encouragement." His name change might have occurred because Barnabas supported the Church when he "sold a piece of property that he owned, then brought the money and put it at the feet of the apostles" (Acts 4:37). This is the first mention of Barnabas in the New Testament. The only source we have that details Barnabas' martyrdom comes from the fifth century. According to that tradition, Barnabas was preaching the Gospel around the year 61 and was arrested, dragged out of the city, and either burned to death or stoned. One tradition states that John Mark found his remains and buried them. Another legend holds that in the year 478, Saint Barnabas appeared to the Archbishop of Cyprus and revealed the location of his burial to him. Archbishop Anthemios then found Saint Barnabas' body incorrupt, holding the Gospel of Matthew. The Roman emperor then erected a church at the site and buried Saint Barnabas there. Though the church was later lost to history, excavations of the site have found a tomb believed to be that of Saint Barnabas. Saint Barnabas is the patron saint of Cyprus because he was the first missionary bishop on that island.

Memorial of St. Anthony of Padua, Priest & Doctor of the Church (6/13) - 1195–1231, Patron Saint of amputees, animals, mail, horses, expectant mothers, fishermen, harvests, lost articles, boatmen, and travelers, as well as the elderly, oppressed, poor, and starving. Canonized by Pope Gregory IX on 5/30/1232. He was declared the Evangelizing Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius XII in 1946. Saint Anthony of Padua was born in Lisbon, Portugal. At age 15, he entered religious life, joining the Canons Regular of St. Augustine near his home. desired greater solitude He moved to the Santa Cruz Monastery in Coimbra, about 100 miles south of Lisbon. At Santa Cruz, Fernando spent nine years in formation and was ordained a priest in 1220. He joined the Franciscans, taking the name Anthony for the patron of the friars' house in Coimbra. One day, he became a reluctant replacement preacher at a first Mass in the local church. Father Anthony awed the congregation with his gift for preaching, knowledge of Scripture, and depth of holiness. He became a sought-after preacher, changing many lives with his humble, yet theologically profound, preaching. He even caught the attention of St. Francis of Assisi, who was concerned about his friars' higher education. Francis entrusted Father Anthony with the theological training of the friars preparing for ordination.

Father Anthony preached far and wide until his death at the age of thirty-five. Pope Gregory IX was so impressed with Anthony's insight into Scripture that he referred to him as the "Ark of the Testament." The sermons that Father Anthony composed for Sundays and feast days of the liturgical year led to his being named a Doctor of the Church with the title, "Evangelizing Doctor."

Saint Anthony is known also as the patron saint of lost items because a friar once stole a Gospel book from Father Anthony. When Father Anthony prayed for its return, the friar returned it and repented. Saint Anthony is often depicted holding the Child Jesus, a portrayal inspired by an account of a friar who reportedly saw Anthony in deep prayer, conversing with the Christ Child.

Springfield, Ill. — A commitment ceremony for the 2024 Springfield Dominican Associate class was held in -person at Sacred Heart Convent Chapel on Sunday, May 19, 2024.

Sherry Miles, of Lincoln, Illinois, is a parishioner at Holy Family Catholic Church and is retired but formerly worked at the State of Illinois Department of Natural Resources. Sherry's commitments include asking God each day to do his will and not her own. She plans to continue to share her faith by singing in the parish church choir. 
The new associates prepared for commitment by participation in nine monthly sessions of prayer and study about the history of the Order of Preachers and the Springfield Dominican congregation, about the theology of mission and ministry, Catholic Social Teaching, and liturgy and prayer. Each candidate was accompanied by a sponsor - a sister or an associate who answered their questions and offered encouragement during their period of discernment before commitment.

Dominican associates embrace the Dominican traditions of prayer, study, community, and ministry. They respond to God's call to share the Gospel by preaching it through the witness of their lives. Each associate was called forward by the associate program director, Sister M. Joan Sorge, OP. They stated publicly their commitment to "preach the Word and witness Gospel values," and received an associate pin from Sister Rebecca Ann Gemma. OP. prioress general of the congregation.

Sister Rebecca Ann accepted the new associates' commitment statements and thanked them for their dedication in preaching the word of God. "We are truly blessed by the witness that we see before us. You clearly live the word of God in your lives with a commitment that proclaims 'God is here,'" said Sister Rebecca Ann. Dominican associates make individual commitments to volunteer ministries in their own parishes and communities. They may also join the sisters on committees and boards, work side-by-side with the sisters in their ministries, or provide logistical support for the congregation's public events.
