Saint Memorials This Week

(Adapted from My Catholic Life!)

Memorial of Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini, Virgin (11/13) - Patron Saint of immigrants, emigrants, hospital administrators, and orphans. Invoked against malaria. She was canonized by Pope Pius XII on July 7, 1946. Mother Cabrini founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred heartafter she was rejected by another religious order. She demonstrated the determination and firmness of purpose that allowed her to spread missions across North America. Though born in Italy, she emigrated to the US and became the first US citizen to be canonized.

Memorial of Saint Elizabeth of Hungary, Religious (11/18) - Patron Saint of Third Order Franciscans, bakers, beggars, brides, charitable societies and workers, exiles, falsely accused people, homeless people, hospitals, lacemakers, nursing homes, nursing services, people ridiculed for their piety, widows. Invoked against in-law problems, the death of children, and toothaches. She was canonized by Pope Gregory IX on May 27, 1235.

Dedication of the Churches of Peter and Paul (11/18) - Today's Memorial recognizes the dedication of two basilicas (Saint Peter on Vatican Hill and Saint Paul Outside the Walls) constructed by Emperor Constantine at/on the locations where St. Peter was crucified and St. Paul was beheaded.

Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne, Virgin (11/18) - St. Rose Philippine Duchesne came to Missouri with the Society of the Sacred Heart to educate and care for Native Americans and the poor of St. Louis. Her zeal and leadership led the sisters to establish schools and orphanages across the U.S.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS PROCESS (RCIA)



RCIA: Initiation incorporation into Christ

The RCIA is the process for the church to initiate a person into the Christian community. The "I" in the RCIA is "Initiation." Initiation happens through Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. The purpose of Initiation is for God to free the catechumen (one asking for baptism) from the power of darkness (sin) and to be joined to Christ's death, burial, and resurrection (the Paschal Mystery).

Through Baptism, all of us were incorporated into Christ and we were formed into God's people, the church. Through our Baptism, we were set on a path to develop a deeper relationship with God. Our Baptism also carries the responsibility to welcome new members who have the potential to renew the church and inspire us to strengthen our relationship with God so we continue to thrive as a community of faith.

Please continue to pray for our catechumen and candidate and the RCIA team as we prepare for the "Rite of Acceptance into the Catechumenate" on Sunday, December 10th at the 10 am Mass at Holy Family Church.
